Age & Opportunity put together a variety of activities for the European Week of Sport which ran from the 23rd to the 27th of September. We organised a cycle in partnership with Fingal Active Travel. A 12km cycle along the greenway from Maynooth towards Kilcock where participants enjoyed a coffee in the September sunshine.



We also held a Walking Football Blitz with the Irish Men's Shed Association. The men's sheds that took part were Naas, Clane, Kilcoole and Plunkett's and it was a fantastic opportunity for participants that had completed the initiative earlier in the year to play against other groups.
