### **Grants Launch**

The Age & Opportunity Active National Grant Scheme is funded by Sport Ireland and offers financial supports to local clubs, groups and organisations nationwide who promote physical activity and sport for older people. This year, we received a significant increase in applications, reflecting the enthusiasm of numerous clubs and care facilities to promote physical activity. We announced the list of our successful grantees on April 24th at an event in the Sport Ireland Campus. Local Walking Football groups, along with other older adult groups attended the event and showcased Walking Football and Go for Life games. Pickleball Ireland also joined us, allowing groups to experience the game firsthand.

Sylvia Guckian, a PAL from the Grange Woodbine Group in Dublin, emphasized the significance of the Grant and the invaluable support it provides to her group in enabling them to effectively engage in activities.

We were inspired by the stories shared by Paul Kelly from Kilcoole Men's Shed and Ciaran D'Arcy from Shamrock Rovers, highlighting the positive impact of Walking Football on their lives and the importance of staying active as we age. We sincerely thank everyone who attended the event and who applied for a grant this year. The grant scheme will reopen in February 2025.
